Frequently Asked Questions

What will I be doing in the 2 hours?

I will be introducing you to the silkscreen process, looking at my personal designs as examples of the different types of silkscreen processes involved. I will give a demonstration on how to print using a silk screen. You will then get to try this yourself.



What will I print on?

I will be giving you 2 pieces of white cotton to print on, after the class you can take this home. This fabric can be used to make 2 tea towels (You can also leave your printed fabric with me and I will have my tailor sew it for you and give it back to you at a later date at no additional cost).



What designs will I be using?

I will be giving you access to my some of my silkscreen designs; you can use these to print with.

Will I get to mix up my own colours?

Printing inks will be available; you can then mix up your desired colours.

Should I bring anything with me?

The printing inks that we use do stain clothing so bring an old T-shirt along. I will be lending each of you a printing apron to wear.
